

The new HAS Consultants contract

16 May 2023

Main new elements of the second HAS Consultants system

- Increase of budget: from 2200 man-days per year for HAS Consultants services to 3400 (ca. 55% more) – pre-defined allocation among sectors.
- More communication and meeting participation: from 20% to 25% (maximum).
- Introduction of feedback mechanism (in case of negative assessments at FV).
- Introduction of a new task for the contractor: Communication and information to the Technical Bodies of the ESOs and to the Commission services, in order to train and explain the beneficiaries of the system on its functioning.
- Introduction of "conditional compliance" assessment result option.



The technical specifications for the new contract

- The Technical Specifications of the call for tenders describe the system and how it will work (https://etendering.ted.europa.eu/cft/cft-documents.html?cftId=9845).
- The specifications provide a full description of the scope of the system, of all related tasks and contain clarifications on the relevant aspects.
- The new elements of the system have been introduced to improve its working, based on the
 experience gained during the implementation of the previous contract and on the feedback
 received from the ESOs and from the desk officers of the Commission.
- The overall intention of the new contract is to ensure a high degree of continuity of the HAS
 Consultants system, improving it where possible but keeping its main principles



Increase of resources

- From 2200 man-days per year to 3400 (Task 10 + Task 20), with a fixed pre-allocation per sector this is a limit to the amount of work to be carried out each year for a specific sector.
- Pre-allocation to be reviewed each year by Commission in cooperation with EY to decide distribution of man-days per sector for the successive 12 months period(s) on the basis of practical experience during the first 12 months and on the basis of the evolution of actual work programmes of the ESOs and related deadlines.
- From 20% to 25% maximum of each consultant's man-days for Task 20 (Communication) hard limit, no flexibility.
- Consultants can attend (on an ad-hoc basis and upon justified invitation) meetings of ESOs/TCs and of Commission expert groups – but no AdCo groups nor coordination groups of notified bodies.



Introduction of "feedback mechanism"

- CD, ENQ and FV assessments remain as before.
- In addition, in case of a negative assessment at FV stage, possibility for the ESOs to revise the draft standard and then to request a second FV assessment, called Last Confirmatory Assessment (LCA) this is a right that ESOs now have.
- This way, the exceptional PUB limited-scope assessment no longer needed => abolished.
- Possibility for Commission services to request an assessment of a final standard (Final Verification), formally proposed for OJ-citation, for the purpose of deciding whether to cite it in the OJ or not.



New possible assessment outcome

- Previously, only binary outcome possible: compliance vs. non-compliance.
- Now, third possible outcome: conditional compliance.
- This option is meant exclusively for those standards, being part of a series developed in parallel and to be adopted and then submitted to the Commission for OJ-citation at the same time, containing normative references to each other.
- In case the only reason for a non-compliance outcome would be the fact that the normative references are to draft standards (prENs) being developed in parallel, then conditional compliance outcome must be used now.



New task for contractor

- EY must provide systematic communication and information to the Technical Bodies of the ESOs and to the Commission services (i.e., to the main users and beneficiaries of the system) to increase knowledge and understanding of the HAS Consultants scope of work, how the system is designed and how it functions in practice.
- Events will be organised to this purpose, also jointly with the ESOs. The present webinar falls under this task.
- This task includes the elaboration by EY of data, statistics and qualitative analyses to be used during the communication and training activities, and the obligation to maintain this set of information continuously updated.



Main principles unchanged but clarified where necessary

- HAS Consultants assess only and exclusively harmonised standards (and GPSD standards, which a legislative proposal in the pipeline will make equivalent to harmonised standards).
- HAS Consultants work for the Commission, supporting the legal obligations to carry out the assessment/evaluation tasks pursuant to Articles 10(5) and 10(6) of the Standardisation Reg.
- The HAS Consultants will not participate in the drafting and consensus building processes of the ESOs and will not have any drafting responsibilities for harmonised standards. They are not responsible for providing scientific, legal or technical advice which would go beyond normal assessment tasks defined in this Contract.
- The role of the HAS Consultants is not to compensate possible gaps in the technical, scientific or legal expertise of a technical body.





Interaction with standards development





- ► ESOs can request maximum <u>4 assessments</u> per WI
- 1 assessment per stage + LCA
- ▶ LCA: full assessment
- Not possible to request assessments of published standards

FWD HAS assessment request



- First working draft (FWD) is optional but **strongly recommended**
- Technical Body secretary submits to CCMC FWD
 - via Submission Interface
 - CCMC Project Manager submits request to EY
 - First draft Annex Z
 - For parallel work: CD-text 1









Assessment of standards: LCA before FV

Outcome

'Compliant'	If the same conclusion is reached by EC, the publication of the reference in the OJ is normally possible without any specific notice
'Conditional compliance'	To be used only in case of problems related to the dates of normative references to other inter-linked standards and meaning that, if the identified issue(s) is positively addressed by the ESO after the assessment, and if the same conclusion is reached done by EC the publication of the reference in the OJ is normally possible without any specific notice
'Lack of compliance'	If the same conclusion is reached by the Commission, the publication of the reference in the OJ is likely not possible without adaption of the document

- Designed to assist Technical Bodies in drafting harmonized standards
- Covers horizontal aspects
- Mandatory as of end 2021
- Checklist shall be completed before dispatching draft standard for all stages
- Checklist strongly recommended when drafting hEN under VA (with ISO lead) and FA

Checklist – Items to be considered when drafting standards answering a Standardisation Request and to be offered for citation in the OJEU

This checklist was prepared following the format of internal Regulations CEN/CENELEC Part 3 – Annex A "Checklist for writers and editors of document". All CEN/CENELEC standards and deliverables shall follow the provisions of IR 3.

This checklist is applicable for all sectors, except construction.

This checklist shall be fulfilled before dispatch for:

- 1. the First Working Draft for optional assessment (if any),
- 2. the draft for Enquiry,
- 3. the final draft for Formal vote,
- 4. In case of lack of compliance assessment, a new optional assessment after Formal vote (PUB assessment).

The Technical Committee secretary in CEN and the Technical body secretary / Reporting Secretariat in CENELEC are responsible for ensuring that the checklist below is filled out and submitted to CCMC with the draft candidate harmonized standards and their supporting documents/justifications where relevant. In CEN, the matrix of responsibilities shall be followed (see decision BT C081/2018).

It is strongly recommended to use of the checklist for the drafting of harmonized standards in support of EU Legislation under VA and FA (with ISO or IEC lead).

- Under final stage of approval
- Will replace previous Checklist in the coming months





HAS Project: Background

<u>Technical assistance</u> to the Commission for the assessment of harmonised standards (implementation of <u>Article 10(5)</u> of Regulation (EU) No 1025/2012 on European standardisation)

- ▶ **Regulation (EU) 1025/2012** on European Standardisation Provides frame to standardisation work
- Article 10 Standardisation requests to European standardisation organisations The Commission may request European standardisation organisations (ESOs) to develop a European standard or a European standardisation deliverable
- (Art. 10.5 of Regulation (EU) No 1025/2012)

"[...] The Commission together with the European standardisation organisations shall assess the compliance of the documents drafted by the European standardisation organisations with its initial request."



The HAS project

is a service to:

- the European Commission
- the technical bodies of the European Standardization Organization


Aims to increase confidence and compliance of harmonized standards and lead to an increased publication rate of references in the OJEU

Main features:

- Ensure typical compliance concerns are identified to reduce non-compliance
- Provide targeted training /support to HAS consultants, ESOs, as well as internal EC services
- ▶ ②Ensure HAS consultants tasks and resources are focused and limited to the assessments of compliance of candidate hENs








Structure of requests received from the ESOs since August 2022

Requests from ESOs per sector since August 2022




Status of Requests from ESOs (05.05.2023)

Number of requests received and accepted vs. Number of completed reports sent to ESOs per month since August 2022 (until 05.05.2023)




- Very high number of requests received in the first 6 months of the HAS project

——Average number of requests received per month


Outcome of assessment reports per sector since August 2022

- Many reasons leading to non compliance and non citation in the OJEU




Best practices for TCs under the HAS System





When to request and assessment and what to expect?



Recap on the role of HAS Consultants:

- Perform verification and assessment tasks
- Work in support of but do not represent the Commission
- Convey the Commission's positions to the ESOs or their technical bodies
- Do not contribute to the standards development process

The EC considers but is <u>not bound</u> by the results of the assessments performed by the HAS consultants



Technical verifications of candidate harmonised standards

- 1. Ascertain whether the standard qualifies as a harmonised standard as foreseen in Regulation 1025/2012
- 2. Verify which legal requirements the standard is intended to cover
- 3. Assess whether the standard sufficiently satisfies those requirements
- 4. Check whether the scope of the standard goes beyond the scope of the relevant standardisation request and legal requirements aimed to be supported
- 5. Establish that the 'non-harmonised content', which goes beyond the scope of relevant legal requirements, is not incorrectly or inappropriately associated with any legal requirements



Technical verifications of candidate harmonised standards — Recap on EC Procedure before deciding to publish references of a harmonised standard in the OJ

Step I: Verification of procedural formalities:


- ✓ standardisation request and Union harmonisation legislation.
- ✓ Absence of a formal objection
- ✓ Annex Z or equivalent informative element is available
- Normative references are made available

<u>Step 2:</u> verification as regards the legal requirements aimed to be covered on the basis of the standardisation request:

- Clarity and transparency of normative parts of the standard aiming to support legal requirements
- ✓ The standard does not contain normative elements outside the scope of the relevant request(s)

Step 3: assessment as regards the legal requirements aimed to be covered:

- To assess whether a standard sufficiently satisfies the relevant legal requirements aimed to be covered
- ✓ non-harmonised content' is drafted in an acceptable way and not incorrectly associated with any supported legal requirements







Best practices for TCs when requesting a HAS assessment

TCs should ensure the following elements are included before submitting a request for assessment by HAS Consultant(s):

- All European elements must be present in the documents submitted for HAS assessment
- TCs are encouraged to request a first assessment as early as possible to increase compliance rate
 of standards submitted to the EC for citation
- Ensure complete Annex(es) Z are provided (for all applicable directives)
- Most recent version of the standard is provided for assessment
- When possible, providing a track changes version of the standards will facilitate the work of HAS consultants after a previous assessment
- Response from TC to the comments of the HAS consultant (Template for comments)

TCs are encouraged to perform a self-verification of these elements when drafting standards and before submitting a request for a formal assessment



Best practices for TCs when requesting meetings with HAS consultants

- Meeting requests should be submitted about 4 weeks prior to the meeting date
- A <u>full agenda of meeting</u> should be provided to allow the HAS consultants to prepare accordingly
- Only meetings linked to a <u>previous assessment</u> are allowed under the HAS project

Reminder on the role of HAS consultants during meetings with TCs

What a HAS Consultant can do


- Convey the Commission's positions to the ESOs or their technical bodies
- Participate in meetings to offer clarification on their assessments (but max. 25% of time is spent on meetings)

What a HAS Consultant cannot do

- Contribute to the standards development process
- Offer guidance to the TCs on how their standards can become compliant
- Perform Assessments on documents received from the TCs/ESOs directly
- Modify completed Assessment Reports
- Participate in meetings without EY approval



Rules for Normative References





Normative references remain an important cause of Non Compliance

Normative references (NRs) relating to clauses that support the legislation's essential requirements

Must comply with certain rules...

The standards listed in the Normative References Clause 2 are normatively referenced within the text, i.e. they are cited in the text in such a way that some or all of their content constitutes requirements of the document, for instance with a "shall".



Certain and clear references

Acceptable references to standards

- Dated
- To European or International standards
- In relevant Sections and Subsections of the Harmonised Standards

Ensure legal certainty and clarity for the users of the standards



Dated or undated normative references?

Clauses or Subclauses referred to in the Annex Z (having legal effect)

Homegrown European standards

Dated in the specific clauses/subclauses of the text of the draft **and** dated in 'Normative References'

European standards adopting ISO standards

The ISO text is undated but the European part contains an Annex referring to dated versions

Undated in the specific clauses/subclaused of the text of the draft **but dated** in 'Normative References'

European standards adopting IEC standards

The IEC text is undated but the European part contains an Annex ZA referring to dated versions

'Zero tolerance' for undated Normative References related to clauses that support essential requirements

Accepted undated references <u>must</u> be agreed upon with the relevant EC desk Officer



NRs must be dated <u>and</u> published

- Dated references
 - Clauses or Subclauses referred to in the Annex Z
- Published standards
 - Published: Legal certainty and clarity on which version applies
- ▶ No reference to draft standards
 - No continuous availability in time
 - Difficulty to keep track of changes
 - ► If blocks of draft standards developed in parallel: conditional compliance MAY apply

Unaccepted examples of normative references include*:

- a reference to a standard removed from OJ due to formal objection
- reference(s) to non-publicly available documents (e.g. draft standards)
- reference(s) to standards containing no clearly defined specifications allowing to satisfy the requirements of the referencing hEN
- non-specific normative references to 'series of standards'
- reference(s) to legal acts
- references which create contradictory normative reference chains (e.g. implying that different versions of the same standards should be applied in parallel)

Possible undated references not leading to a Lack of Compliance

Limited number of cases could be acceptable (subject to EC acceptance)

- Standardised consumables or sizes that do not change over time
- Terminology standards / databases
- Graphical symbol standards / databases
- Plugs and socket outlets dimensions (catalogue standards if not standardised in Europe, such as in the case of Europlug)
- Electrical installation standards if not in sections supporting Annex Z
- Undated references in clauses not supporting legal requirements



Allowed and nonallowed normative references

Allowed references:

- ► European Standards: EN, EN ISO, EN IEC
- ► International Standards: ISO, IEC, ISO/IEC, ITU R
- Some international benchmarks:
 - IMO or ICAO
 - ► CIE
 - UIC Specs
 - ETSI Partnerships (such as 3GPP, OneM2M, ...)
 - Some well known consortiums applying FRAND principles (Bluetooth, USB C,...)



Allowed and nonallowed normative references

► <u>Not</u> allowed :

Reference to National adoptions of ENs (BS EN, DIN EN)

Reference to National standards from NSBs (NF, UNI, UNE...)

References to other national standards (ANSI, Canadian, AU/NZ standards,...) or

to other US SDOs (ASTM, UL, ASME, SAE, ASHRAE, IEEE,...)



Examples of acceptable references

EN, EN ISO, EN IEC:

- EN XXXX:202X
- EN ISO YYYY:202X
- EN 6XXX:202X
- EN 55XXX:202X
- EN IEC ZZZZ:202X

- EN/ASTM XXXX:202X
- EN ISO/ASTM YYYY:202X
- EN IEC/IEEE UUUU:202U



References to draft European or draft international standards

- Not accepted in general
- See criteria on "Conditional Compliance"
- Need to ensure availability and traceability in time (future)
 - Some drafts ISO/DIS or ISO/FDIS are publicly available and can be purchased today but maybe not tomorrow
 - New versions of the draft will be made available instead of the version that is being referred to in the draft under assessment
 - Once the new version of the standard is approved as a published ISO standard, this published version will replace the draft versions
 - Old draft versions will no longer be available, not even for purchase



Where to date Normative References?

NRs should be dated in:

- Section normative references (or European annex if ISO or IEC)
- Clauses or Subclauses referred to in Annex Z

NOTE: Attention to "State of the Art":

- The most recent standard (if compliant) should be used No references to outdated standards (no longer state-of-the-art) or to superseded/withdrawn standards
- Unless there is an <u>objective</u> and <u>justified</u> reason for using an older version



References to Standards in Annex Z are NOT allowed

Annex Z is NOT the place to include references to other standards

In some cases, references to Part 1 of the same standard can be included
 (if the Part 1 has exceptions to be applied in conjunction with the assessed standard)

-> in these cases, confirmation with the EC Services is needed [examples: Part 2-x of EN 60335 and Part 1]



Conclusion

Normative references (NRs) play an essential role in providing presumption of conformity

NRs shall:

- respect applicable drafting rules of the ESOs
- provide legal certainty and clarity for the user
- be dated and published
- be fully compliant in case they support essential requirements
- remain available over time for the user of the standard

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
