Questions asked by the Attendee(s)	Answers from the Presenter
Compatibility between the old and the new template?	The old version and the new version of the template are perfectly compatible. If a standard has been drafted using the old version, it can be opened in the new version and the text will be updated automatically once the information under the Doc.info tab has been updated.
European foreword of EN ISO, how is it possible to integrate a specific sentence before the ratification (because the foreword is drafted by CCMC)?	CCMC is responsible for drafting the European foreword for parallel work with ISO. If a special sentence needs to be added, a request can be sent to the publication team via the e-mail <a href="mailto:production@cencenelec.eu">production@cencenelec.eu</a> and one of the editors will take care of this special request.
Many mistakes in the standards come from the normative references, is there a way to make it automatically?	During the editing process, the CCMC editor will use the eXtyles tool to help prepare an xml version of the text. One of the benefits of this tool is that it will automatically correct any mistakes in the titles of normative references. It will also inform the editor if any references are outdated or withdrawn and will provide the correct superseding reference so that the editor can update the text.
Is the .dot CEN aligned with the IEC .dot?	The Standard Template for Drafters can be used by both CEN and CENELEC members to draft documents. Since the Internal Regulations Part 3 is based on the ISO/IEC Directives - Part 2, the structure and drafting rules that guide the template are the same.
