- ✓ economic development,
- √ social inclusion and
- ✓ environmental protection.

✓ were adopted by all United Nations Member States in2015

✓ universal call to action to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity by 2030





































- ✓ are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all,

- The European Green Deal is putting Europe on a pathway to a Sustainable future
 - > is 'an integral part of the European strategy to implement the UN 2030 Agenda and the SDGs
- Action: mainstreaming sustainability in all EU policies
- Relevance for Standards
 - ✓ EU plans to set new standards for sustainable growth
 - ✓ The Green Deal will make consistent use standards



CEN/TC 465 – a new standardisation committee for "Sustainable Cities and Communities"



Scope

The proposed series of standards will support the development and implementation of a holistic and integrated approach to the achievement of sustainable development and sustainability in response to the needs of European cities and communities.

- Established in January 2020.
- French secretariat (AFNOR) and German chairmanship (DIN).
- Technical Committee's Chairperson: Mr Holger Robrecht

Recommendations to other TCs on how to include the UN SDGs in their work



- Develop standards that are designed to respond to your context and contribute to the SDGs.
- The SDGs should be integrated in all standardisation works.
- Don't forget that the SDGs covers the three dimensions of sustainable development: economic, social and environmental.
- ❖ Take into consideration the importance of having a positive impact at the Global level.
- "Leave no one behind"
- Don't forget to involve relevant stakeholders.

World wide production: 4,5 – 5 million tons

Largest producers: Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Indonesia, Cameroon, Ecuador

Millions of small holder farmers and highly concentrated industry

Origin: Amazon basin Ecuador/Peru


Large number of cocoa varieties. Mainstream is Amelonado and Amazonia

Development of chocolate: from end 19th century, mainly Europe, US & Japan

Development of sustainable cocoa: market share around 20 - 40%

- Child labour
- Farmer revenues
- Deforestation
- Yields
- Environmental impact
- Gender equity
- Gene variety

 Improved professionality for farmer organisations, better support for farmers, farm development plan
- Part 2: Performance requirements for people, profit and planet
 Deals with the sustainability issues
- Part 3: Traceability
 Consumers assurance
- Part 4: Scheme document

- ✓ It is relevant for almost all business sectors,
- √ SDGs are at the heart of EU policies,
- ✓ Consider how your standard can support one or more of the SDGs and refer to it in your standard,
- ✓ Actively encourage participation of sustainability experts in your committee,
- ✓ Refer to CEN and ISO tools for further guidance (for instance CEN Environmental Helpdesk and ISO Guide 82: 2019)
